Required documents are as follows:

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA OR G.E.D.: If you are submitting a GED, but you attended High School for any time, even if you did not complete all 4 years, you must submit your High School transcripts along with your GED. High School and/or GED documentation is mandatory.
Applicants are strongly encouraged to submit College and/or Trade school transcripts and any other certifications that they may have earned.

HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS: If the applicant left high school to earn a G.E.D. you must obtain a transcript up to the date of when the applicant left high school.


